महाराष्ट्र के मंत्रालय, मुंबई में आपके साथ दो बार महत्वपूर्ण बैठक हुई। मध्ये प्रदेश सरकार का विमुक्त घुमक्कड एवं अर्द्धघुमक्कड, के बारे में. सकारात्मक रवय्या देखकर बहुत खुशी हो रही है। आपके द्वारा अत्याधिक महत्वपूर्ण विषय के बारे में. जो पहल हो रही है इसे मध्ये प्रदेश का दबे कुछले समाज को न्याय मिलेगा। यह उम्मीद जागी है। माननीय मंत्री जी श्रीमान अत्तरसिंह आर्य, समाजिक न्याय विभाग, मध्ये प्रदेश सरकार इनको भी मै तह दिल से धन्यवाद देना चाहूंगा कि विमुक्त घुमक्कड एवं अर्द्धघुमक्कड, समाज को महाराष्ट्र के तर्ज पर अलग आरक्षण देने के बारे में. विचारविमर्श करने हेतु आपको कहा गया है यह बात अपने आपमें सामाजिक न्याय के कडी को डॉ. बाबासोहब आंबेडकर के 125 वी जयंती के उपलक्ष में जोड़ने वाली बात है।

मध्यप्रदेश मे विमुक्त घुमक्कड एवं अर्द्धघुमक्कड, समाज को अलग आरक्षण देने हेतु आपको मंत्री परिषद की मान्यता लेने हेतु पहल करनी होगी। ओबीसी. के 14% कोटे से 4% विमुक्त घुमक्कड एवं अर्द्धघुमक्कड, समाज को देना पड़ेगा। भारतीय संविधान मे धारा 16.4 में. यह प्रविधान है। "इस अनुच्छेद की कोई बात राज्य को पिछडे हुये नागरीको के किसी वर्ग के पक्ष में जिसका प्रतिनीधित्व राज्य के राय में राज्य के अधिन सेवाओ मे पर्याप्त नहीं है, नियुक्तियों या पदों के आरक्षण के लिए उपबंध करणे से निवारित नहीं करेगी।"

अतः मेरी गुजारीश है कि राज्य सरकार के सेवा और शिक्षा और अन्य सामाजिक कल्याण के क्षेत्र में. 4% आरक्षण विमुक्त घुमक्कड एवं अर्द्धघुमक्कड, समाज को दिया जाए।

इस संदर्भ में महाराष्ट्र सरकारने जो निर्णय लिए है उसके जी. आर. की कॉपीज साथ मे जोड रहा हूँ। कृपया इस संदर्भ मे अगर आप भोपाल में संबंधित सभी अधिकारी गणों के साथ बैठक बुलाना चाहोतो मुझे कृपया सुचित करें।

RESOLUTION:- The Government of Maharashtra has issued orders reserving vacancies in Government services for members of the Backward Classes and sanctioning certain concessions in their favour in the matter of their recruitment to Government services. These orders were reviewed by Government in the light of the recommendations made by the Committee appointed under the Chairmanship of Shri F.D. Deshmukh to go into the question of reservation of seats and allied matters relating to the recruitment of Backward Classes to Government services and Government is pleased to direct in modification of the existing orders as follows:-

I Composition of Backward Classes :-

According to the existing orders Backward Class consist of the following sections viz. (i) Scheduled Castes, (ii) Scheduled Tribes and (iii) Other Backward Communities. Government has decided that the grouping should be revised and the Backward Class should consist of the following section, viz:-

- (i) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Castes converts to Buddhism;
- (ii) Scheduled Tribes including those living outside the specified areas;
- (iii) Denotified Tribes and Nomadic Tribes and
- (iv) Other Backward Communities.

II Reservation of vacancies:-

In modification of the existing orders making reservation in favour of members of the Backward Classes, Government is pleased to direct that the following percentage of vacancies occurring in each of the various services under it which are filled by direct recruitment should be reserved for members of each of the sections of the Backward Classes viz:-

These percentages represent the minimum number of vacancies to be filled by the appointment of members of the Backward Class and Government desires to make it clear that it is open to the appointing authorities to recruit members of the Backward Class in excess of these percentages if they are otherwise considered suitable for such appointment vis-a-vis other candidates on merit. Government is also pleased to direct that if any of the vacancies reserved for the members of a particular section of the Backward Class cannot be filled by the appointment of members of that section for want of suitable candidates, they should be filled by the appointment of members of other sections of Backward Class, if such candidates are available and if no such candidates are available, by others i.e. by the members of non-Backward Class. These vacancies i.e. the vacancies which are filled otherwise than by the appointment of candidates belonging to the particular section of the Backward Class should, however, be carried forward and added to the vacancies reserved for the particular section (i.e. the section for which they were initially reserved) on the next occasion when vacancies are filled. Government is, however, pleased to direct that such vacancies should not be carried forward in this manner for more than two years and that the total number of normal reserved vacancies and the carried forward vacancies together should not exceed 45% of the total number of vacancies on any occasion of recruitment. The surplus above 45% should be carried forward to the subsequent occasions of recruitment subject, however, to the condition that the vacancies are not carried forward for more than two years.

2. These orders take effect from the date of issue and are applicable throughout the State. Government is also pleased to direct that the various concessions which were available to the members of Backward Classes in the western Maharashtra region regarding the reservation of vacancies, the relaxation of age limit etc. should also be extended throughout the State and should be admissible to members of Backward Classes throughout the State irrespective of the region of the State to which they belong. Pending unification of the list of other Backward communities for the entire State, the concessions should be admissible on the basis of the list of other Backward Communities at present in force in the respective regions, i.e., members of the communities included in those lists should be treated as belonging to the Backward Class for purpose of recruitment to vacancies reserved for them and also for other concessions admissible in the matter of recruitment to Government service throughout the State.

3. Government is also pleased to direct that all appointing authorities should take particular care to see that these orders making reservation in favour of members of the Backward Class in the various services are followed scrupulously.

CIRCULAR OF GOVERNMENT

The Commissioner for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in his 21st Report had referred to the safeguards relating to the appointment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes to services and posts, provided under the Constitution, and had raised the question whether he can call for the original records and files in specific cases where complaints have been made to him so that he can satisfy himself that the safeguards provided for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the Constitution have not been violated. Government has carefully considered this question and has decided as follows.

Proposals involving officers of Class I and Class II belonging to the Backward Classes as would adversely affect them in respect of confirmation, promotion or retirement should be shown to the Minister (Social Welfare). Minister (Social Welfare) may communicate his views on such proposals off the file, to the Minister in charge of the Department. However, the responsibility for decision will rest with the Minister in charge of the Department. These instructions will not apply to cases of officers of the All India Services.

In view of the above arrangements it would not be necessary to send the original files or record in regard to individual cases to the Commissioner for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.

**RESOLUTION :-** Government has had under consideration the question of making special provision for the promotion of Government servants belonging to the Backward Classes to higher posts. Government is now pleased to direct that while the principles prescribed in Government Resolution, Political and Services Department, No. 4099/34, dated the 18th December, 1950, should continue to be observed, the cases of Government servants belonging to the Backward Classes should be judged with special sympathy and promotion should not be denied to such Government servants unless they are considered definitely unfit for promotion or unless promotion is ordered by competent authority to be withheld as a measure of punishment.

2. The special sympathy required to be shown in the case of Government servants belonging to the Backward Classes with regard to standards of efficiency. In respect of character and integrity the criteria of fitness should be applied with equal strictness to all Government servants, irrespective of whether or not the Government servant belongs to a Backward Class.

3. Returns should be submitted by Heads of Departments to the Administrative Department of the Secretariat concerned by the end of January and July, each year of all cases of supersession of Government servants belonging to the Backward classes occurring in their Departments during the preceding half year ending on 31st December and 30th June respectively, excluding cases in which the supersession has been ordered or approved by Government. The returns should give the name, designation, pay, qualifications, age and length of service of each Government servant who has been superseded the designation and scale of pay of the higher post to which appointment by promotion has been made and reasons in brief for the supersession.

## RESOLUTION OF GOVERNMENT

The Study Group on Social Welfare appointed by the then Government of Bombay for formulation of an approach to the IIIrd Five-Year Plan had recommended that a common and single list of Vimukta Jatis and Nomadic and Semi-Nomadic Tribes should be prepared, and that a common programme for their welfare, should be implemented under the IIIrd Five-Year Plan.

2. Having accepted the recommendation of the Study Group the then Government of Bombay under their Resolution, Labour and Social Welfare Department, No. 1060-E, dated 14th April 1960 created the post of an officer on Special Duty for the unification of the lists. Under Government Resolution, Education and Social Welfare Department, No. BCE-1060-J, dated 18th October 1960, the Officer on Special Duty was directed to undertake an extensive survey of the areas inhabited by the Ex-Criminal Tribes and Nomadic and Semi-Nomadic Tribes throughout the State, study their living conditions, ascertain their felt needs and the ways and means of meeting these needs and, on the basis of such a survey, make recommendations for a uniform list of these communities for the consideration of Government.

3. At present there is no recognised list of Vimukta Jatis in Vidarbha and of the Nomadic and Semi-Nomadic Tribes in Vidarbha and Marathwada, although persons belonging to these communities are found in all the Regions of the State. The Vimukta Jatis and Nomadic and Semi-Nomadic Tribes of which there are two separate lists in Western Maharashtra are socially, culturally and ethnologically akin to each other.

4. The Officer on Special Duty submitted his final report to Government in July 1961. As a result of its consideration, Government is now pleased to direct that the Communities shown in the accompanying Schedules I and II should be treated as belonging to the Vimukta Jatis and the Nomadic Tribes in the State of Maharashtra for all purposes.

5. Government is further pleased to direct that all previous orders issued in connection with the classification of Vimukta Jatis and Nomadic Tribes and Semi-Nomadic Tribes in the various component units of the Maharashtra State should be treated as superseded by these orders.

RESOLUTION

The question of providing reservation for certain sections of the Backward Classes at the stage of promotion had been under consideration of Government of some time past Government has now decided that there should be reservation for the three sections of Backward Classes, as mentioned below in promotions made on the basis of seniority subject to fitness, in appointments to all Class I, Class II, Class III and Class IV posts in grade of services in which the element of direct recruitment, if any, does not exceed 50%.

Percentage to be reserved.

2)	Scheduled Tribes including Those living outside the Specified areas.	7%
3)	Denotified Tribes and Nomadic Tribes	4%
